Thank you to parents for dropping the children at Thoulston and to Mrs Rayner for organising their day.

On Wednesday, 20 children took part in the annual **West Wilts Golf** competition. The two teams competed at 10 stations, scoring as many points as possible as part of a team. It is always a fun event, led by the fantastic Kingdown leaders. Mrs Lamont and Mrs Newbery said that the children were yet again fantastic – gaining even more points through Life Skills – encouraging, complimenting and supporting one another. Team B finished 3rd in their competition.

Good luck to our 9, Year 6 children who will be sitting their **SATs** next week – Monday through to Thursday. They have worked so hard with determination and maturity, and I hope they feel confident, happy and prepared for each test – SPAG, Reading and Maths.

In June, Year 4 have their multiplication times table check and Year 1 have their phonics check. Can I remind parents, that children do not need rucksacks in school – except if swimming on a Tuesday.

Sports Day 16th May – all parents are invited to attend. We aim to start for 1.20pm and finish at around 3.15pm. Please park sensibly around school so that emergency vehicles can get past! Your child can wear a house colour T-shirt to school for that day: Yellow for Longleat, red for Cley Hill, Blue for Shearwater and green for Wylye. If anyone has any spare blankets or ground sheets for the children to sit on, it is always appreciated.

Next week, we have three visitors from the **Trowbridge Islamic Trust** to talk to the children about why a Mosque is important to Muslims. Thatchers have been thinking about questions they would like to ask our visitors.

Keeping children safe: This week, I have spotted children running at speed out of the school gates at home time. I hugely encourage you to speak to your child about road safety, especially as we have no pavements in the village and many vans heading down towards Shearwater.

Please do not arrive early to school – parking up prevents the Stop and Drop working efficiently. When leaving the school area in your cars, once you have collected your child, please continue with the 'one-way system' down Broadmead lane.
