Homework: We have spent time in staff training meetings discussing our current homework expectations. We feel that **Power Projects** are an important way of extending and embedding pupils' learning and vocabulary whilst also preparing children for future homework expectations, particularly meeting deadlines set. Since September, Power Projects are only given before each half term holiday, so 3 times a year, to be completed before the end of the next short term. Spending some time on our topics, which also now spread throughout the 'big' term, before starting the Power Projects, should help the children with ideas for their homework.

We do expect all children to do **at least one** of the tasks but we politely ask that no more than 3 are brought in school. On deadline day, homework will be shared in the 'school museum day'. We emphasise that children should lead their homework choice and be proud of completing it, on time and with increased independence as they get older, so that they can present their work.

In addition to this project-based homework, we cannot stress enough how important reading is, for every child, as part of our homework expectation. This includes reading a good book to your child, as well as hearing them read aloud and encouraging them to read independently and quietly alone, most nights. Maybe sign up for library cards, if you haven't already. They are free and your children can choose their own reading book. From Year 1, children also have spelling passports which should be practised regularly. Children in KS2 also have times tables passports which again must be practised regularly. By Year 4 children should know all times table and related division facts, up to 12 x 12. Year 2 children, following their maths unit on times tables last week, will also have a times table passport in their bookbags, imminently.
