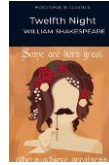


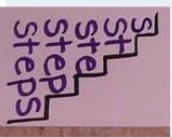

Ways to practise tricky words

2 Find the word in a book.	
3 Steps – write the word adding a letter each time.	
4 Funky letters.	
5 Red vowels and blue consonants.	a e i o u Words
6 Dot the letters.	

You could also try: Apps like the Spelling Shed; typing the words onto a computer or tablet; ask someone to write the word in three different ways, with only one correct spelling; then mark them, finding the right word and correcting the misspelled words.
