PLANNING PERMISSION HAS BEEN GRANTED! A NEW KS2 IS EVER CLOSER!

Staff and children have coped wonderfully with our new class arrangements. It is an exciting time as we all get used to having 4 classes under one roof!

Gussie and I met with our builders this week: some key points...

- We are handing over possession of the KS2 area on Tuesday 28th May. Fencing will go up from the edge
 of KS1, by the canopy, all the way from Thatchers playground to the Friendship Forest. The builders will
 not be in school and staff and children will not have access to the build area. The car park will not be in
 use either.
- The first week or so will be preparing the area and taking down the canopy and all the wiring associated with alarms, the internet and electricity. We will be hopefully moving the car park security system and moving it to Potters playground gate. It has been great to hear positive comments about our fencing outside the main entrance as an added security measure at home time and this will also help while children from Thatchers and Foresters gain access to the playground.
- Once completely clear and ready, the KS2 green mobile will come down possibly around 17th June.
- The timber frames are being made off site so there may be little progress on site for a few weeks.
- The majority of building work will proceed in August.

- Completion date will be around mid-October; slightly later than originally planned but more realistic.

 Therefore, classes will remain as they are now for Term 1 of the Autumn term.
- After half term, we will do stop and drop in the morning and children will walk along the road, close to the wall and greeted by another member of staff. All children will go in through the main entrance to their classrooms.
- Deliveries have been requested outside of busy school times we do hope that this is adhered to but know from other work in the area, it is not always the case. Please be patient.
- Throughout the project, we have a project manager from the Diocese Gusssie and I will meet with him every other week and we hope to give regular updates.
- At home time, 3.20 and 3.30pm children in Potters and Weavers will be collected from Potters playground and children in Thatchers and Foresters will be collected from Thatchers playground. I appreciate that mention of the Stop and Collect option once again, but with additional works traffic in the area, this is not something I will consider at the moment.

LATE COLLECTION CHARGES: Late Club starts for all children if not collected after 10 minutes -Potters and Thatchers by 3.30pm and Weavers and Foresters by 3.40pm and a charge will automatically be added to **Scopay**. Collection from **Late club is between 4 and 4.15pm**. Children collected after 4.15pm will be charged for extended late club automatically on Scopay.

This year's **Sports Day** was brilliant and so much fun. It was so lovely to see the whole school come together on our top field for a traditional Sports Day. The children competed with joy and maturity and demonstrated perseverance to complete their races. Thank you to you all for supporting your child – it was great to see the school community altogether. Thank you, children and staff for all your effort and enthusiasm.

Saturday 22nd June is Crockerton Village Street Party and we have been invited to do a stall and share our planning to raise some more funds for School. If anyone is able to help out or has some ideas about what would work well, please do let me know!
