Write a caption to go with each picture. The Christmas Day Truce is believed to have happened on the first Christmas Day of World War 1. Can you find out about some of the events of that day and create a comic strip, showing what happened.
Explore your creativity: Write a War poem or prayer for Remembrance Day. Sit in your garden and draw what you can see, then paint it using colours that represent your feelings, rather than the colours you can see. Mix colours to get the right tone.	Values Friendship and Compassion: Write a letter to a friend or family member that you haven't seen in a while. Include something that would cheer them up. Find out about a charity working in Warminster and create an advert to advertise what the charity does and how people can contribute to it. You could film your advert or make it as a poster.	Science and Technology: Design and create an animal. Think about what the animal would eat, what kind of animal it is (reptile, mammal etc.) and its body parts. Take a picture of a tree in your garden or nearby. Is it an evergreen or a deciduous tree? How does it change each week of our term? Make a Weather Vane or/and a Rain Gauge and record weather over a short period
