If you are reading with the children, useful questions might include:

- Did you enjoy that book? Why? Why not?
- Who was your favourite character? Why?
- Which part of the story did you like best? Why?
- Was there any part you didn't like? Why?
- Would you like to be a character in the story? Which one?
- Would you choose this book/story again?
- Was it like any other book you have read?
- How is the main character feeling at the start/middle/end of the story?
- Why did the author choose the title?
- Find a word you don't know the meaning of. Using the text around it, what do you think it means?
- What might happen next in the story?
- Is the ending what you expected? Were you surprised by the ending?

Non-Fiction texts

- What is on the cover of the book? What does this tell you about the content inside?
- When might someone use this book? Why?
- Can you find an example of a page you think has an interesting layout? Why did you choose it?
- What makes this text successful and interesting?
- Is there a contents page and an index?
