The effort that they all put in was commendable. 6 children achieved 10 metres mostly on both their front and back and an amazing 15 children achieved 25m again, mostly on both their front and back. We will test again, hopefully, in March. This means that **66% of our KS2 children can now swim 25 metres** either on their front or back. This is fabulous and such an important life skill. By the end of KS2 all children should be swimming 25 metres. All our Year 6 children can do this!

It was lovely to read the **Parish Magazine** this week – we had our children doing my job by writing a piece themselves this month! Well done to Alys, Hermione and Millie. It was also lovely to read that Henry (and his dad) had joined the Autumn litter pick around Crockerton, and was thanked by the Parish Council. Well done, Henry.
