Spring in the Park: **Sunday May 7th...** please save the date. Our older children have been asked to do the May Pole Dancing for this event in Warminster Park with The Dance Lady. It would be great to have everyone's support for this.

Children in years 1-6 were lucky enough to be entertained by the **Welsh Brass Trio** this week. The children enjoyed a funny, engaging and inspiring concert, which not only exposed them to beautiful pieces of music played by a variety of brass instruments, but also fascinating information about the development of brass instruments, including the ins and outs of how they work. The children listened exceptionally well and showed respect to our visitors. We hope the trio have inspired the next generation of brass musicians!

School Uniform — we have some older children who are not wearing correct school uniform whether that is uniform or PE kit. Navy blue trousers, shorts (tailored style), skirts or pinafores should be worn with green polo shirts and navy blue sweatshirt. School shoes should be worn. On PE days, navy shorts, tracksuits or leggings, navy T-shirt and burgundy hoodie is the correct PE kit with trainers. Except on very cold days, a neck scarf should not be worn in the classroom. No wrist bands, fitness trackers or jewellery should be worn except small studs and only simple plain hair bands. Long hair must be tied back each day.

On-Line Safety Talk for Parents led by Karl Hopwood at Sutton Veny Village Hall. Apparently, this was brilliant! I hope those who attended have taken away lots of great advice and top tips about how to keep their children safe while on-line.

This week, the Wiltshire Learning Resource hub held an online webinar for Key Stage 2 pupils across Wiltshire with author Steve Cole. It was a lively and humorous talk, all about Steve's enthusiasm for books and stories. He showed the children some books he had created, aged 9, and stressed that if you like writing, keep doing it! During the question-and-answer session, Blue's question was posed to Steve; apparently it can take an afternoon to write a book or a couple of months, depending on the length.

During our recent weekly meetings, staff have discussed our **current behaviour policy**, including our Going for Gold, dojos and our 'Bronze, Silver and Gold' stamps. We have seen recently that children are becoming very anxious about these, which impacts on their daily learning. Can I emphasise here that the behaviour in class is usually exceptional, noted by visitors, County advisors and ourselves, regularly, so this means there is very little disruptive behaviour affecting learning in lessons. Children usually always try their best, know that we all learn differently and understand that mistakes can help them make progress. All children know what is expected of them and that we use our 3 School Rules and our Church School Values to drive this. Therefore, we are not using our Going For Gold system at present. We continue to award class dojos, often discreetly. Our 30 stamps for either Bronze, Silver, Gold, Platinum are exceptional marks for really going above and beyond during the school day — not just for Power Projects and again these are often recognised and recorded quite discreetly. Our policy will be updated soon to reflect these changes.

Please remember to book **Late Club** in advance so that names are on the register beforehand. If you have used Late Club and not yet paid, please do settle up. If your child is collected from Late Club, payment will be asked for — usually the squash and biscuit has been eaten.

The builders are still finishing our **playground area outside Potters**. The fencing around the school playground is complete. Potters' playground will remain OUT OF BOUNDS TO ALL into next week. It's looking great and I can't wait for it to be ready to share. The children have loved watching the progress and the digger! Potters will continue to come out from the Main Entrance at 3.05pm.
