Thank you to Mrs A and Miss Hedley for organising this again for this cohort - it really does help settle the nerves and ensures that the children are well fed and ready for the morning!

I had the annual visit from the **Education Welfare Officer** last week to discuss our attendance. I am delighted that, at that point in time, we are at 96%. However, she raised the ongoing concern that we have many Holiday Requests. Please can I reiterate that holidays should not be taken during term time. The following info may help: 'You have a legal responsibility to make sure your children get a suitable education (as set out in the Education Act 1996). For the majority, this means making sure your child is registered at a school and that they attend regularly during term time.'; 'A penalty notice is an alternative to you being taken to court by the local authority. If your chila has 10 or more sessions (5 days) of unauthorised absence, the school will inform our Education Welfare Service who may issue a penalty notice for each child to each parent.'; 'The penalty is £120 per child per parent if paid within 28 days.'

Your help with this would be much appreciated.
