We are committed to safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children and young people

Rationale

At Crockerton Primary School we are proud and fortunate to have caring and supportive parents and carers, who fully understand and commit to our Church school values of Friendship, Compassion, perseverance, respect and trust. This results in a caring school community, with a strong relationship between home and school. By working together, children benefit from the necessary skills, attitudes and behaviours that will prepare them for adulthood.

By working together and fully participating in the life and work of the school, children will:

- achieve their best.
- become caring, hard-working and responsible individuals.
- Meet and overcome any challenges of change, either in school or at home.

At Crockerton CofE Primary, the school will work to benefit the children by:

- 1) Upholding the Christian culture and ethos of the school and promote our Church School Values, following all safeguarding and child protection procedures, listening respectfully and calmly to children and following up any disclosures sensitively to support the child's welfare.
- 2) Providing a broad and balanced curriculum and a safe environment in which children can develop spiritually, academically, physically and socially.
- 3) Sharing information about your child's progress, attendance and news about school life. This will always be done maturely, professionally and respectfully and with understanding of the child and their family.
- 4) Having high expectations of work and behaviour, meeting individual needs.

At Crockerton CofE Primary, parents and carers will benefit the children by:

- 1) supporting the positive culture and ethos of our school by setting a good example through their own speech and actions towards all members of the school community; Parents should follow the school protocols and guidance, eg, ensuring children attend school, payments are made for wraparound care, booking meals and the procedures for delivering and collecting children from school.
- 2) Providing school with information that may be affecting your child, approaching the school to resolve any issues or concerns promptly and in a calm and respectful manner and dialogue with staff, talking about serious issues privately, not in front of the children.
- 3) Having high expectations of work and behaviour, correcting their own child's behaviour, respecting the school environment, supporting children with their learning and ensuring that children are prepared and ready for school each day. We ask parents and carers to keep the school and its local vicinity tidy, not bringing dogs onto the school grounds and to park respectfully within the neighbourhood.

In order to support a peaceful and safe school environment, parents or carers must not:

- 1) demonstrate disruptive behaviour that interferes with the safe operation of a classroom, the office or any other part of the school grounds. This includes using abusive, threatening and/or offensive language or displaying temper, in person, by email by telephone or when using social media.
- 2) threaten harm or use physical aggression towards another adult or child. This includes approaching someone else's child in order to discuss an issue or chastise them and physical punishment towards your own child on school premises (some actions may constitute an assault with legal consequences)
- 3) Damage or destroy school property.
- 4) Smoke or vape within school grounds; the consumption of alcohol and other drugs, or accessing the school site whilst intoxicated is not tolerated.
- 5) Undermine staff or school by publicly criticising, questioning school policy or practice, or by making slanderous/defamatory comments damaging to the school.

The above behaviours on the school grounds will be reported to the appropriate authorities, the headteacher and the Governing Body (or in extreme cases the Law Courts) and may result in an adult being prohibited from entering our school grounds to safeguard our school community.

We trust, and thank you in advance, that parents and carers will assist our school with the implementation of this policy and help us to provide a positive and safe environment for the children.
