# One in five primary pupils start school with a healthy weight but are fatter when they leave, data shows

- One in five children who start primary school a healthy size leave overweight
- · Figures reveal boys were more likely than girls to pile on the weight at school
- 75.9 per cent of kids who started school overweight or obese remained this way
- The Government says it is committed to halving childhood obesity by 2030

I was shocked and sad at these headlines yesterday. Whilst I do not see this here, it acts as a reminder when packing your child's packed lunch boxes to ensure that that remains the case. I do actually notice very full lunchboxes with lots of packets of crisps, biscuits, cheese and cake bars on a regular basis.

Christmas Cards — a reminder of the email and dojo post sent out on Wednesday. Please have a go at designing your cards — they all look so great when they arrive and children are always excited to receive their packs of Christmas cards, paper, mugs etc! ALL ARTWORK and ONLINE ORDERS with PAYMENTS need to be made by Monday 3<sup>rd</sup> October.

Last week I shared that teachers were noticing an increasing number of children not reading regularly at home. Thank you to all who have tried to make a change. All children, 4-11 years old, benefit from regular reading to improve fluency, recognising key words, comprehension skills or improve their stamina for reading – this one is key to 'End of Key Stage' SATs tests. We recommend hearing your child read, as well as reading to your child, every night.

Please check hair regularly for **headlice**. Shoulder length or longer hair must be tied back every day at school. Swimming staff have also asked children to have long hair hair tied up or to wear swimming hats.

Swimming lessons at 3.30pm. I have had many requests asking to leave early to attend swimming lessons. Please consider very carefully as it is very difficult for a teacher to remember when certain children are leaving early on a variety of nights! I know lessons are busy but I would ask that you do not accept a lesson time that means your child leaves school early.

5<sup>th</sup> October will be our annual **Sports Day** – get your House Colour T-shirt ready! Weather permitting, we will start races at 1.15pm. Late Club and Latin will run as usual but school may finish earlier than usual, 3pm ish. Please park away from school, enjoy a walk and consider our neighbours! Your child should come to school with a **water bottle** every day — please do not keep this in the book bags as they do sometimes leak causing damage to school and library books.

Please **do not have rucksacks** in school — with coats, hoodies, book bags already on pegs it becomes very difficult for children in our small cloakroom areas.

Attached is a letter about the maths lesson you are invited to, later in October — your child will come home with a paper copy for you today so that reply slips can be returned asap.

As a staff and as a Governing Body, we have been discussing our 'No Nuts' advice. We continue to ask that children do not bring nuts into school in their packed lunches — spreads, packets, bars etc and that parents consider carefully where nuts/nut oil may be present. Thank you for your support with this so that we continue to be 'Free from Nuts' as much as possible.
