- Research what types of fossils have been found in the UK, create a map locating where they have been found and what type of animal they have come from.
- We have been learning about Mary Anning, can you find 5 interesting facts about Mary Anning. Present this as creatively as you like.

- Research tools they used in the Stone Age to Iron Age have a go at making one out of paper mâché
