As I said at the start of term, staff have completed first aid training and a significant part of this involves using AEDs — **Defibrillators** — we are grateful to having one of these at the main entrance. The trainer shared statistics with us and with 80% of cardiac arrests happening at home, staff discussed whether we knew where our nearest defib is to our houses. I would love to know where they are situated. (There really should be an appif I could I would!) The trainer also shared the importance of children knowing what to do in an emergency — their address, who to call etc. I am sure that many know already but it certainly made me think and ask even my older children if they knew what to do and if they knew places in Warminster where defibs may be accessed and how they work. Please do let me know if you spot AEDs (defibs) while you are out and about. What do the signs around the defib say?

Mrs Woodley also attended a webinar about **Strep A and scarlet fever**. The latest advice is to watch for high temperatures and coughing especially. If you child is unwell with a high temperature and constant coughing, please do not send them in and they are advised to stay off school for 98 hours. Children who have had chickenpox recently are more likely to develop a more serious form of Strep A so please do be mindful of this and let us know if your child has chickenpox.

Attendance: 95% or above is our target this year! All classes are at 95% or above for these first 3 days. If your child is well enough to be in school — they really need to be in.
