Reflecting and Update on building work!

As we head towards the end of the Autumn term, can I start by saying a huge thank you to you all. I am very aware of many changes to routines, pick-ups, entry points, home times, extra PEs, extra welly walks etc as we juggled the new building. Back in May, we cleared KS2 and adapted to very tight teaching conditions. It was not ideal, but it really was the best possible scenario and enabled us to have all the children on site. Staff and children did brilliantly during Term 6 and Term 1; for me, the worst bit was the start of Term 2 where we were so nearly ready but not quite! However, we are all delighted with the project and absolutely love the new classrooms and toilets, as well as the changes to the staffroom and Thatchers class which also benefit the school so much.

I appreciate it is not quite finished... so here is the update. On January 16th work resumes to finish the front of the school. We have committed some extra money to improve the playground surface from the carpark to the front of Thatchers. Then some finishing off will be needed to the ramp and the far side of the build, 'up the lane'. Tarmacking should be finished by the 24th January so hopefully by the end of January, I envisage most jobs will be completed. We also have a 'popping' problem with the vinyl in the corridor; the solar panels need to be connected up; a new door fitted into the kitchen; plus some small 'snags' to sort.

From today, you can now collect KS2 children from the front playground. Foresters will come out from the main door at the end of the ramp. Weavers will remain in their classrooms, and when staff see the correct parent, the children will exit from their classroom door. (There will be some changes again, when work starts on the front playground on 16^{th} Jan)

On the 13th February, Bishop Andrew will bless our KS2 building; we do expect quite a few guests attending this special ceremony at 11am.

As I said, it has been a very difficult, albeit exciting, seven months but now we look forward and enjoy some settled time. I really want to thank all the staff who have been as professional as ever and never once let our standards slip.

Breakfast Club and Extended Late Club: We have a new doorbell on the main entrance into the New Build. Therefore, Breakfast Club children can go through Thatchers playground and up the ramp to Breakfast Club. This is exactly the same routine for parents when collecting the children from **Extended** Late club. Late Clubs will mostly be from Teachers' rooms — Monday from Thatchers, Tuesday from Potters, Wednesday from Weavers, Thursday from Thatchers and Friday from Weavers.

Potters and Thatchers Nativity: This was such a delight to watch and the children did fantastically well, both in the afternoon and in the evening performances. Thank you so much to friends for selling refreshments and raffle tickets. Nearly £200 was raised.

Weavers and Foresters Carol Concert: Please read the letter sent out this week. KS2 Children will be practising in Church in the morning. Please drop your child at the Church between 8.40 and 9am. A bus will bring them back to school. A £2 donation would really help towards the cost of this, many thanks.

Christmas film night on Wednesday 18th December. Hopefully, children who signed up for Film night will have a great evening. I can't wait to watch 'That Christmas' for the 2nd time!

This could be a great boost to the Friends Committee, who have been very generous to fund building works.


