Potters Autumn Term Power Project -Dinosaurs

So far this term, Potters have found out about many different types of dinosaurs, and have grouped them into categories, such as size, diet and physical features. We have found out about the different habitats that the dinosaurs lived in (swamps, plains, mountainous regions) and have started to explore what happened to the dinosaurs 66 million years ago. For Power Projects this term, I would like the children to follow their own interests about dinosaurs and what they would like to find out more about. I have come up with a few suggestions!

- Paint a picture of your favourite dinosaur and find out facts about a favourite dinosaur that you can tell the class.
- Use collage to make a picture of where a dinosaur may have lived (waterfall, volcano, sea)
- Make a model of a dinosaur use recycled materials! I have included some images of previous models below.

We hold a Crockerton Museum Day for all the power projects. The classes all visit each other to see the fantastic learning that the children have done at home on their projects. It really is a special day in the school year, please look out for photos and updates from the day.
