Year 4 will also have their multiplication and times tables check in May, so please ensure children are also practising these. Miss Sides has sent out an invitation to a **times table workshop** for Year 2 and above parents on 30th January at 3.45am. Please do try to attend.

We are still waiting to receive a report following our Ofsted. I will keep you updated once it has been agreed.

Wrap Around Care — Mondays and Tuesdays are extremely busy! When these are full, sadly they are full due to ratios for children/adults. If you do not need your space, please remember to cancel off.

Please can all children have a **carrier bag/PE bag** with spare indoor shoes/soled slippers/crocs in over this wet/snowy month.
